Cooking or Serving Spoons




Spoons vary in length (11", 13", 15", 18", 21") for ease of spouls vary in length (11, 10, 15, 16, 21) for ease of use in cooking or serving. Spoons can have plastic handle that are heat-resistant. Level scoops, ladles, and portion servers provide more accurate portion control than serving


Specialty Spoons

Fraction to Decimal **Equivalents**




Cutting Diagrams for Portioning





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
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
